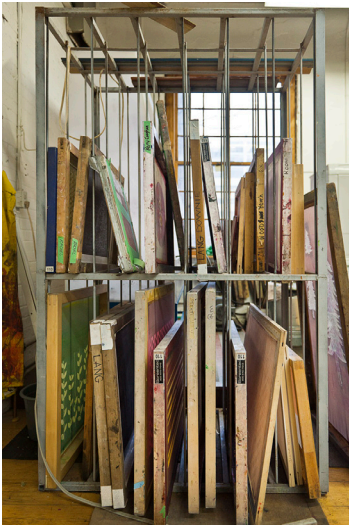


CONTEMPORARY TEXTILE STUDIO CO-OP STUDENT SUMMER RESIDENCY PROGRAM 2017

We are now accepting applications for student summer residencies at The Contemporary Textile Studio Co-op for 2016. CTS Studio relies on our members' diverse backgrounds and perspectives to spark innovation and creativity. We invite textile artists from diverse communities to apply.

Summer residents have extensive access to our beautiful, 1200 square foot, equipped studio at 401 Richmond Street West in Toronto, Canada.

SUMMER RESIDENCY

Application Deadline: April 14th, 2017

1. Duration: May 1st - August 31st, 2017
2. Open to all full-time arts and design students exploring textiles in their work and intending to return to school full-time in the fall
3. Subsidized monthly studio fees of \$175 per month, pro-rated to reflect the length of student's residency/project
4. Includes access to CTS annual international artist summer workshop at significantly reduced rate (June/July 2017)
5. Successful applicants will provide their own materials including screens for printing work, fabrics, pigments, dyes and auxiliaries
6. Most studio-owned equipment is available for use by summer residents with orientation; residents will supply their own specialized equipment (please note that not all equipment and textile processes can be accommodated in the CTS Studio)
7. Students who successfully complete their residency may be eligible for a fall/winter part time residency while continuing their studies

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

1. Résumé and a brief expression of interest outlining your interest in, and any applicable experience related to, the textile arts and to working within a co-operative arts studio
2. 3-5 digital JPEG images with a list indicating dimensions, date, title and materials, or reference to website
3. Brief outline of the applicant's intended summer project(s), including the processes, materials and equipment needed
4. Estimate of the expected time usage for the studio – number of weeks, days per week, and times of day (e.g. weekdays/weekends, mornings, afternoons, evenings, full days, etc.)
5. Two professional references, including e-mail addresses and phone numbers (references should include a textile instructor and studio technologist if possible and cannot include an existing Co-op member)
